The handover in which all the old radio links in MS are removed before the new radio links are established is known as hard handover.**

**Answer for What is the difference between soft and hard handoff?**

**Hard Handover:-** When mobile(in Call) switches to a new sector/Cell which is on different frequency , then it performs hard Handover. It is basically an inter-frequency handover. **SOft Handover:-** When mobile ( in Call) switches to a new sector/cell which is on the same frequency then it is called a soft handover.

**What is the difference between soft and hard handoff?**

In a soft handoff, the cell is allowed to cycle, find that better tower and then be pulled into the tower.
